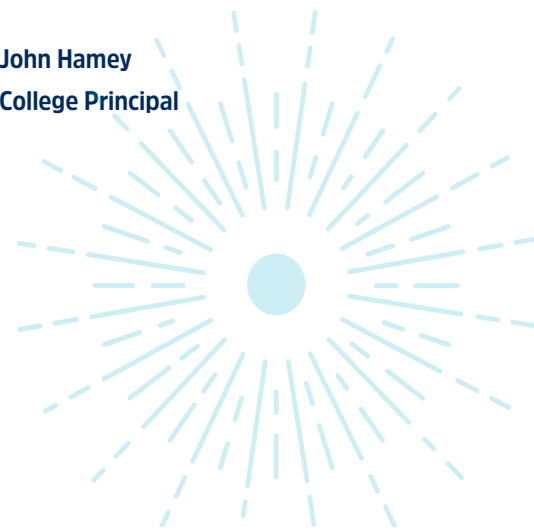
years, will secure our future and make for a better world.

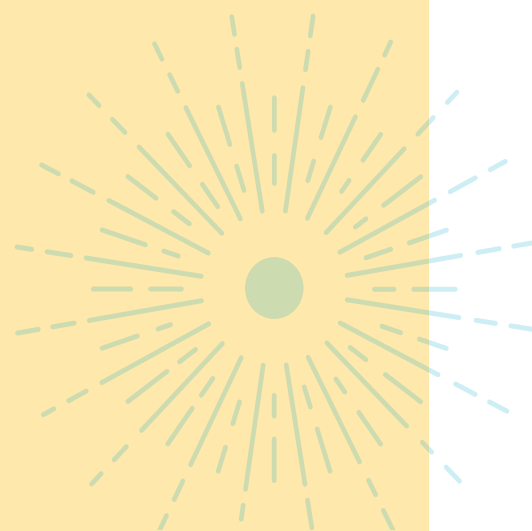

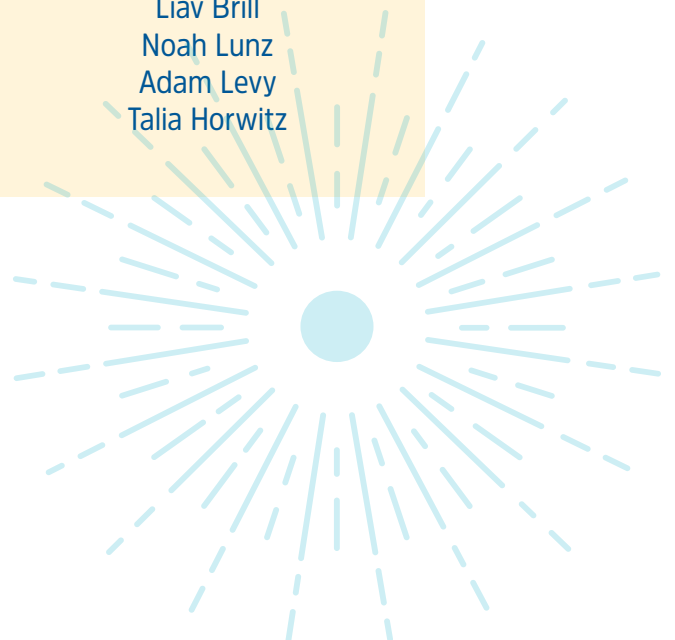
