Moriah College invites outstanding individuals to apply for the following position: **Rabbi of Kehillat Moriah** This is a **Full time permanent position (part-time applications will be considered).**

An exciting opportunity has become available for an engaging, personable and organised individual to lead Kehillat Moriah to become a Shule of choice in the region, and in particular for Moriah families to choose the Kehillah to celebrate their children's Bar and Bat Mitzvahs. To support the Moriah family and Kehillah with life cycle events.

Key Duties & Responsibilities:

- To lead all aspects of the Moriah Shule and Kehillat Moriah community from spiritual, to operational and communal.
- To promote the Kehillah as a Shule of choice in the region and an attractive/preferred Shule in which to celebrate Bar/Bat Mitzvahs with the associated Bar/Bat Mitzvah preparatory and commitment programs.
- To be a guide of Halacha (with deference to the College Rabbi as Ma'ara Da'tara), Hashkafa and provide Rabbinic counselling/welfare support, as well as celebrations and congratulatory recognition to all 'members' of Kehillat Moriah.
- To lead all Shabbat, chagim and eventually some weekday services.
- To create Shiurim and experiential programs for the Kehillah.
- To lead outreach programs, marketing and promotional campaigns, supported by the College Marcomms team, to ensure the Synagogue becomes a household name in the community.
- To ensure children, their parents and people of all ages, at all stages of Jewish affinity, knowledge and development, feel welcome and comfortable in the Kehillah.

Experience Required:

- Rabbinic ordination from a reputable provider (Relevant Tertiary qualifications, ie: Education, Counselling etc are a bonus)
- Experience running Synagogue services
- Strong community mindedness, affinity towards, and engagement with, Jewish causes and with Israel
- Live and model an authentic Modern Orthodox lifestyle imbued with powerful Zionist ideals.
- Ability to work collaboratively as part of a team but also be autonomous, self-driven, organised and diligent
- Ability to engage with members of the Jewish community from all walks of life
- Passionate and enthusiastic about helping young people and their families.
- Highly developed verbal and public speaking skills.
- Well-developed written communication skills.
- Literate in Microsoft Office Suite.
- Ability to work to deadlines in a fast-paced, busy environment.
- Ability to prioritise.
- Ability to build positive relationships with all College stakeholders and the broader community.
