What is the difference between a Bursary and a Scholarship to attend Moriah College?

A Bursary to attend Moriah College is the award of funding to cover, or partially cover, fees and other costs for a fixed period of time. A Bursary is means-tested and does not require an examination or a level of academic achievement. A Scholarship provides an amount to help cover fees and other costs of attending Moriah. A Scholarship is not means-tested and depends on the results of an examination and other identified criteria.

How is a Moriah College Bursary different to Financial Assistance?

A Bursary is means-tested and is awarded for a specified period of time and set amount (usually between 50% and 100% of tuition costs.) Financial Assistance is also means-tested; however, it is only granted for up to 50% of the tuition fees and is reviewed annually.

For how many years is a Bursary in effect?

Bursaries are available for all students across Years K-10 for the duration of their schooling.

What exactly does a Moriah Bursary cover?

Full Bursaries cover the tuition fees, Building & Infrastructure levy, Jewish Studies levy and Security levy relevant to the student's year level. All other costs associated with enrolment, including camps, extra-curricular activities, IT levies, book levies and uniform costs are not covered by the Bursary. The College provides all Bursary recipients with a one-off gift certificate to assist with initial uniform and costs.

Who are the decision makers?

Bursary applications are awarded after consideration by the Committee. Following interviews with the College Admissions department and leadership team, Bursary recipients will be recommended to the Committee for endorsement.

If we currently receive Financial Assistance, can we still apply for a Bursary?

Current Moriah families are welcome to apply for Bursary Support if they are having difficulties in meeting tuition fee payments. All Bursary applications are assessed on merit. Please note there is only a limited amount of funding available to support families to pay tuition fees.

Are there other options available if we are not awarded a Bursary?

Bursary application process

***Thank you for your interest in the Moriah College Bursary Program.
Below are the steps for application and offering of Bursaries for 2021.***

- **Complete and return the Bursary Application Form** by Friday, 24 April 2020. Applicants who are not currently enrolled at the College are required to complete an Application for Admission Form.
- **The Debtors and Fee Support Committee (the Committee)** will assess your application using a fair and consistent, confidential, means-tested process.
- **Following consideration** by the Committee, we will advise you of the outcome of your application.
- **Recipients not currently enrolled** at Moriah College will be invited for a College tour with the Director of Admissions, before finalising their enrolment.



Bursary criteria

Three criteria are considered in the review of your application for a bursary:

1. Demonstrated financial need.
2. Resonance of the College ethos and values.
3. Is the College well placed to meet the particular needs of the child and the family?
